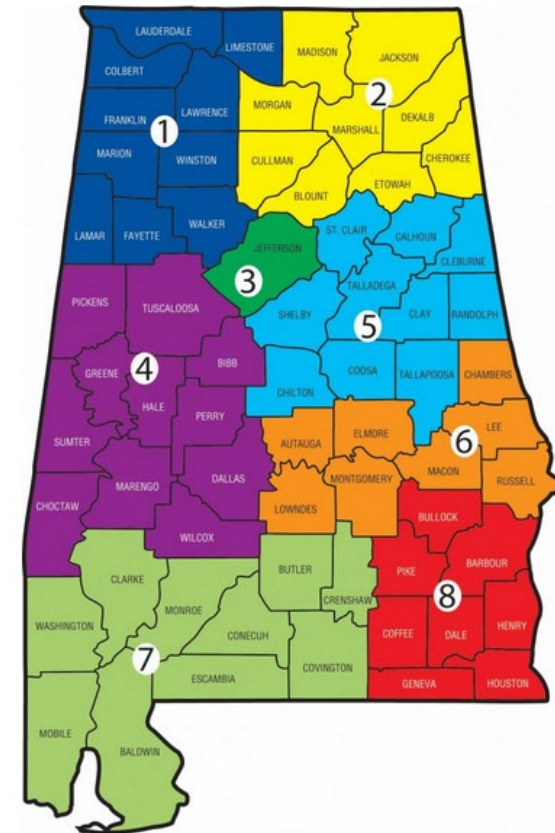

# House Bill 414

---

## WHAT IS HB 414?

- House Bill 414 is a bill sponsored by Representative Ed Oliver and was filed in the 2022 Legislative Session to accomplish 4 things that 911 directors across the state have been working diligently on for the last 5 years.
- HB414 is the result of a combined effort between Rep. Oliver, 911 Directors from across Alabama, and the Alabama 911 Board.



# House Bill 414 (cont.)

---

## **WHAT DOES HB414 ACCOMPLISH?**

1. Authorizes the Alabama 911 Board to develop minimum training standards for Public Safety Telecommunicators, establish a PST training and certification program, and oversee the compliance for all PST's. This program will be created, implemented, operated, and maintained by Administrative Rules.
2. Defines a First Responder, which includes a Public Safety Telecommunicator, therefore it officially classifies a PST as a First Responder in Alabama.
3. Updates old and outdated language relating to the types of technology currently used across Alabama for receiving and processing 911 calls.
4. Requires a Public Safety Telecommunicator to remain on a call with a 911 caller until the caller has been connected with the appropriate provider of emergency services.
