Legacy Cost Reimbursement: Estimated vs Actual





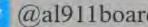

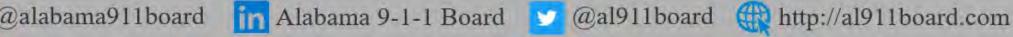
- ➤ Dekalb County 911 quotes received; will work with vendor to set date. District was awarded grant towards legacy to SIP conversion on 09/21/2022.
- ➤ Tallapoosa County 911 quotes received; will work with vendor to set date. District was awarded grant towards legacy to SIP conversion on 09/21/2022.
- ➤ Midfield 911 scheduled for October 25, 2022 but had to be pushed due to communication failure between vendor and district regarding need for map data. Board office downloaded remediated data on 10/31/22 to share with vendor.
- ✓ Irondale 911 SIP conversion occurred on or before November 3, 2022.
- ✓ Dallas County 911 SIP conversion occurred September 28, 2022.
- ✓ Lee County 911 SIP conversion occurred October 24, 2022. Per PSAPs, immediate improvements in call-handling occurred and there have been no further reports of call duplication.







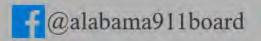


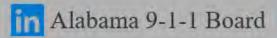

2023 CPI Adjustment

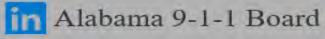
§11-98-5 (c) (2) states:

(2) The 911 Board, not later than October 1 in the year 2018 and each fifth year thereafter, shall adjust the 911 charge to produce an increase in the baseline 911 revenues sufficient to increase the amount distributed to each district under this chapter during the immediately preceding fiscal year by an amount equal to the rate of growth, determined as a percentage, in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for such five-year period. Once adjusted as provided in this section, the resulting revenues shall become the baseline 911 revenues until amended or adjusted under the procedures established in this chapter.

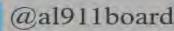
§11-98-5.2 (b) (3) states:

Within 90 days of the effective date of any adjustment in the statewide 911 charge to increase the baseline 911 revenues under subdivision (2) of subsection (c) of Section 11-98-5, the base distribution amount shall be increased by an amount equal to the product of: a. the total amount distributed to the district in the immediately preceding fiscal year, multiplied by b. the rate of growth, determined as a percentage, in the CPI-U utilized by the 911 Board for the prior five-year period pursuant to subdivision (2) of subsection (c) of Section 11-98-5.



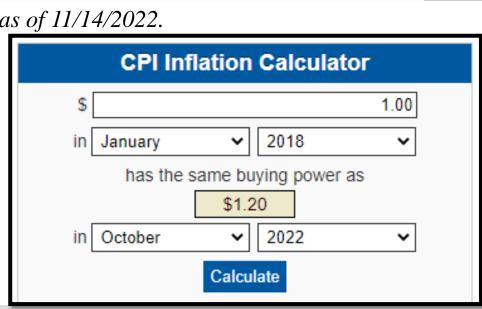

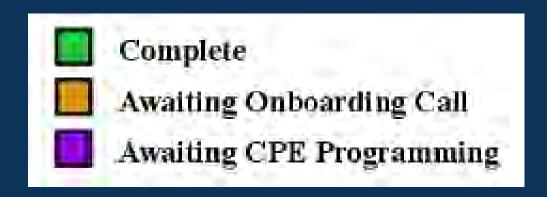


Lumen Circuit Replacement as of November 1, 2022

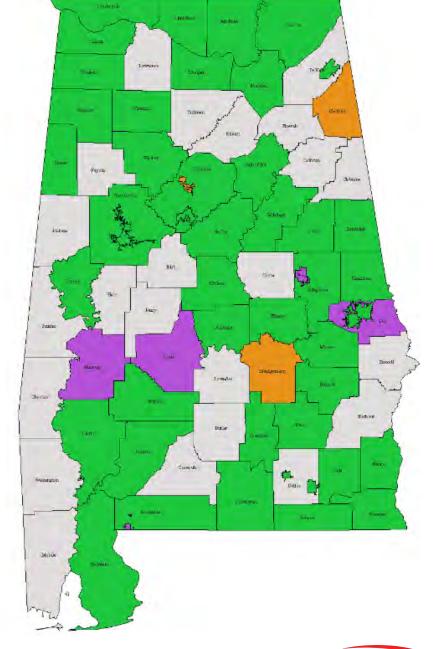

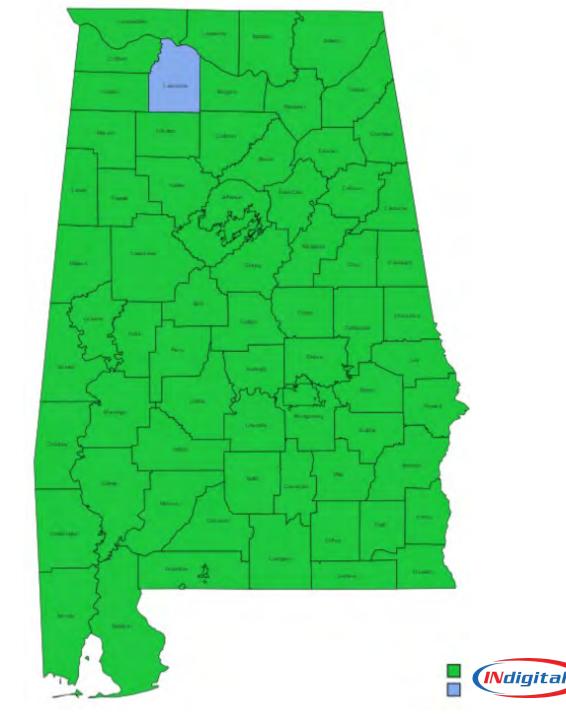

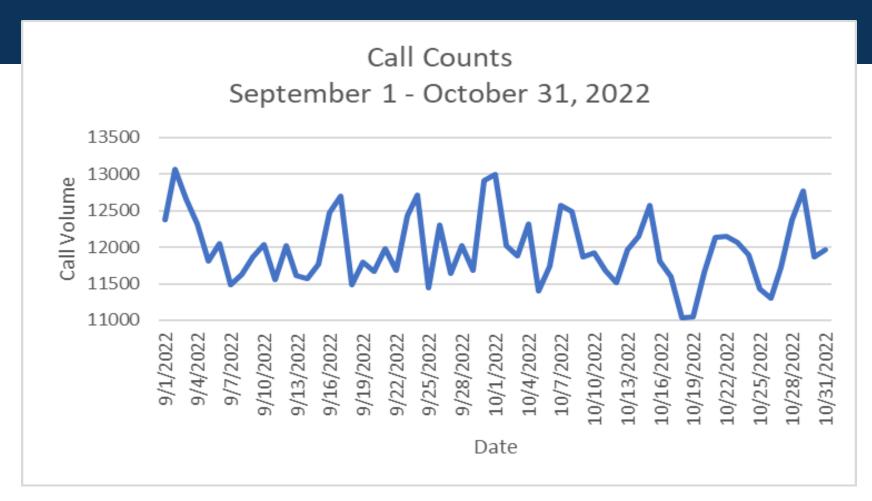
ESiNet Trends

The busiest day during the reporting period was September 2nd – 13,065 calls were processed. This was the Friday before Labor Day.

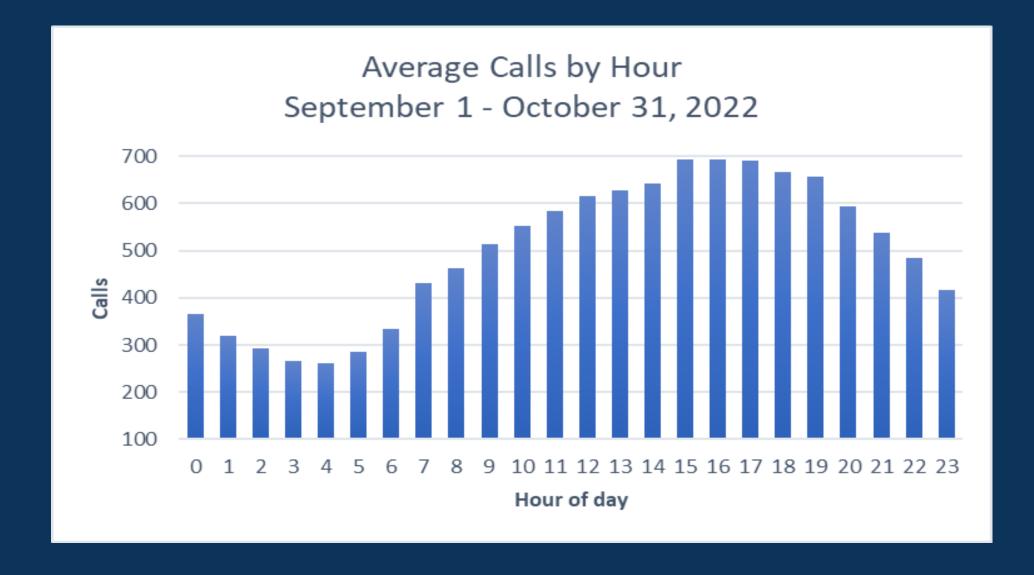
The second busiest day was October 1st – 12,995 calls were processed.

Total calls since the last report was 730,708.

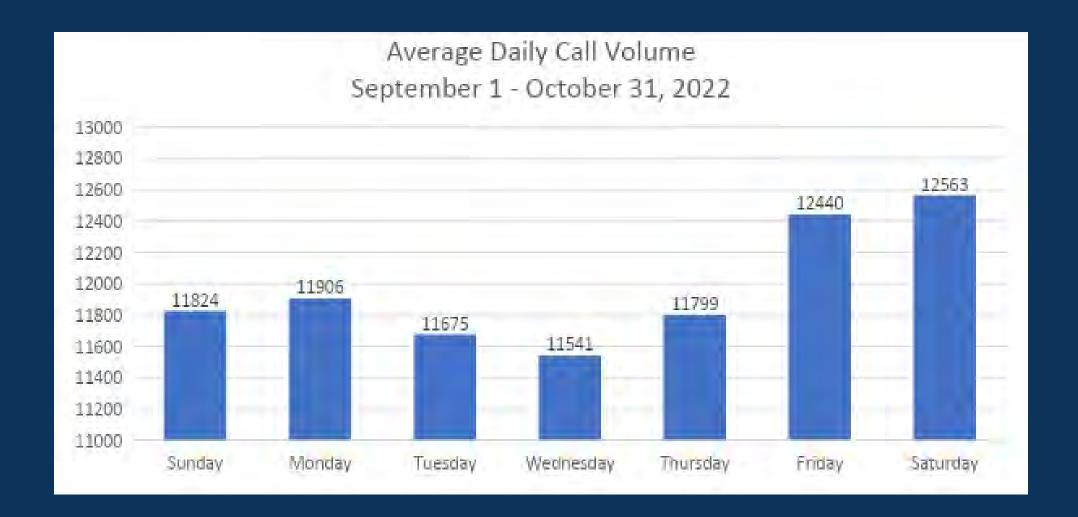






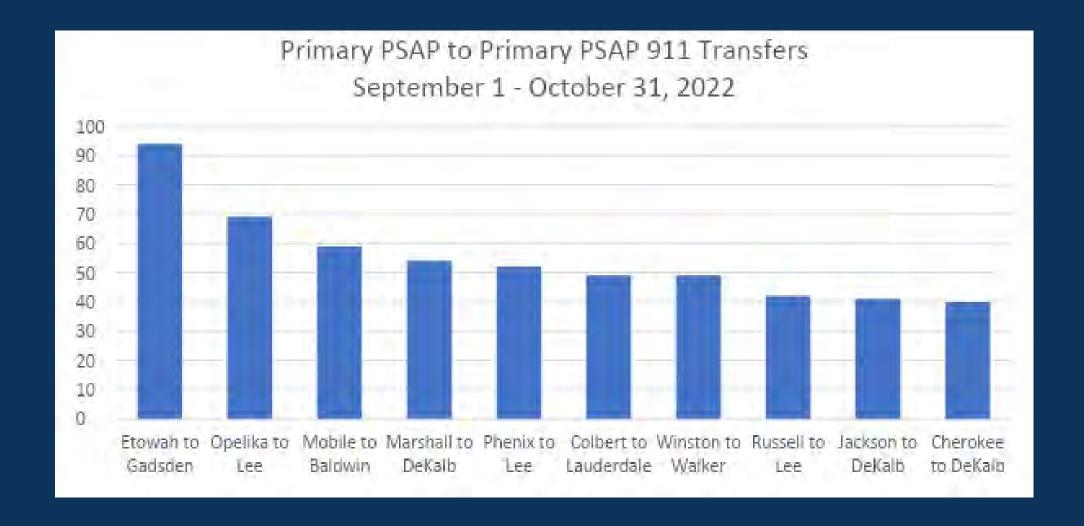
The 4:00 a.m. hour was the least busy, and the 3:00 p.m. hour was the most active for the reporting period.





Saturdays proved to have the heaviest call volume with Wednesdays showing the least for the reporting period.

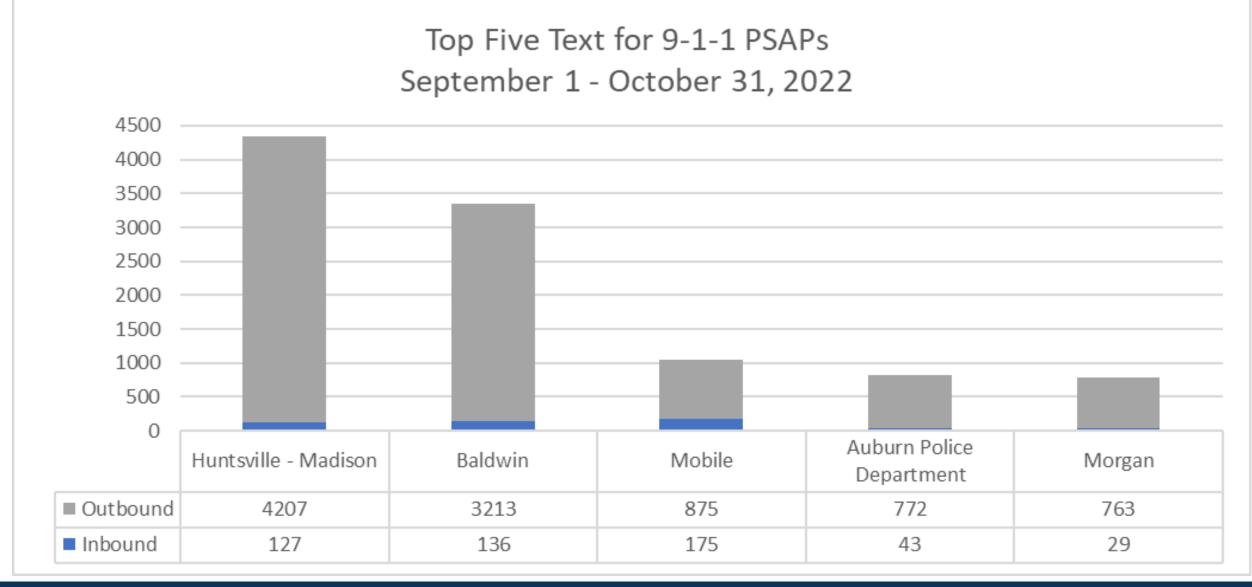




There were 2,314 Primary to Primary PSAP transfers for the reporting period.

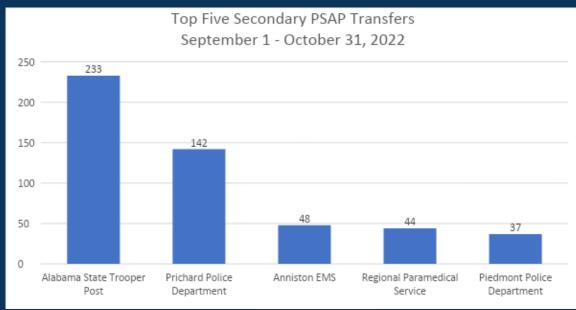

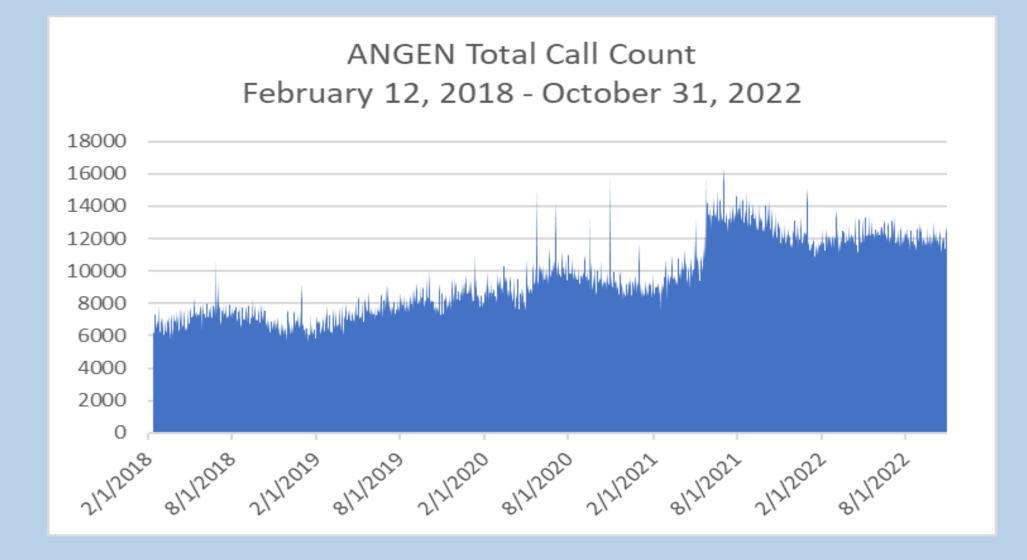
There were a total of 834 Out of State PSAP transfers for the reporting period, down from 889 last reporting period.

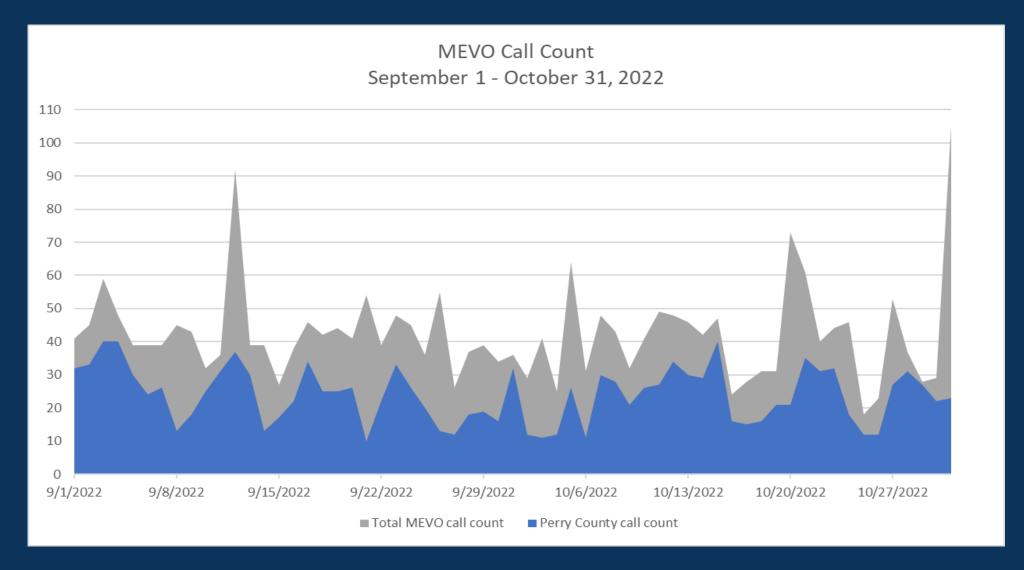

Total Call Volume for February 12, 2018 – October 31, 2022: 16,462,981



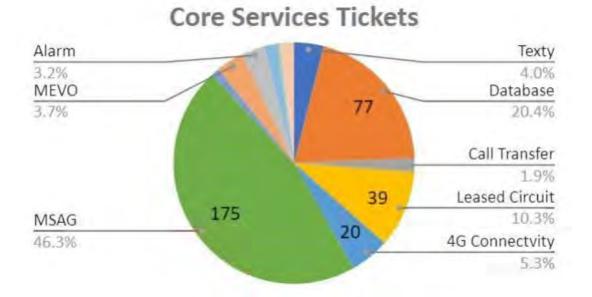

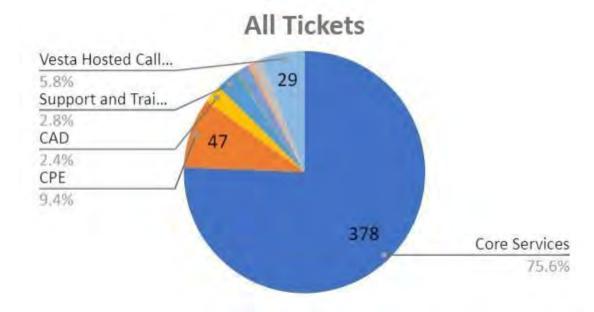


Trouble Ticket Analysis

Significant Event Analysis

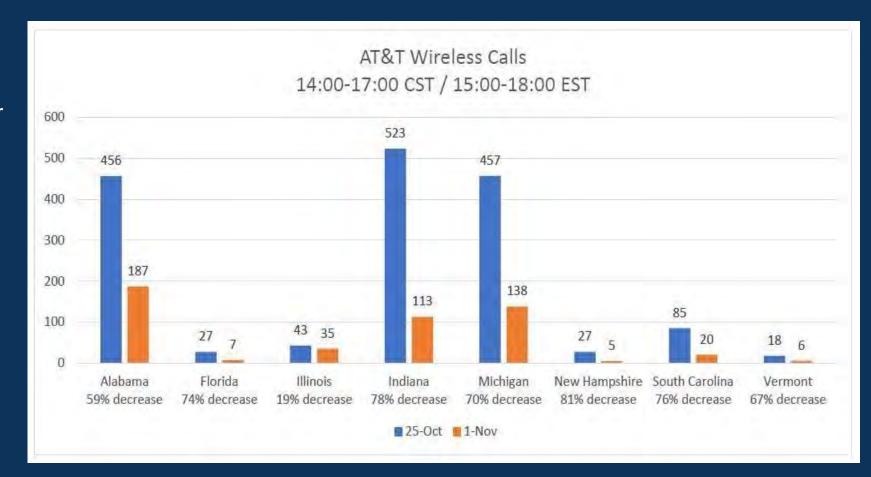
AT&T Wireless - Default Route Event

November 1, 2022

AT&T had an issue with their database provider Intrado on Tuesday, November 1st. This caused the majority of their wireless calls to default route or take a PSTN route for PSAP delivery.

While we are unable to quantify exactly how many 9-1-1 calls didn't make it to our networks (the exception being Alabama whose default pool took the load), we did analyze from the previous vs current week for the time of the event.

Alabama has a record of 218 calls that were default routed, during this time period, using the round robin routing strategy.



As the graph portrays between 19%-81% (by state) of the AT&T wireless calls during that time were not routed appropriately over our networks.
