Key Questions

"Where is the patient bleeding from?"

If the patient is female with vaginal bleeding, "Could she be pregnant?"

Go to: Pregnancy Problem 58

If a limb or digit is fully or partially removed, go to: Amputation 14

"Is blood squirting out?"

"Is there a bleeding control kit available?"

Go to Bleeding Kit Instructions on the Medical Devices tab. 95

Pre-Arrival Instructions

- 1) If bleeding, use a clean cloth and apply pressure directly over the wound. Do not remove. If the cloth becomes soaked, add more to what is already there.
- Elevate bleeding extremities.
- 3) For nosebleeds:

Apply direct pressure by pinching the nose tightly. Lean forward and hold pressure until help arrives. If blood is in mouth, attempt to spit it out.

- 4) Any tourniquet that has been applied should be left in place.
- 5) If teeth have fallen out, locate if possible. Do not touch the root and place them in a container with milk or clean water.
- 6) Have the patient lie down and be still.
- 7) Keep the patient calm, if possible.
- Gather the patient's medication, if any.

Bleeding / Laceration

Secondary Questions

- "How much blood can you see?"
- "How long have they been bleeding?"
- "Is blood squirting out?"
- Is the patient a hemophiliac or free bleeder?
- "Is the patient on blood thinners?"
- "Has the patient recently traveled outside of the country?"

Personal Reminders

Emergency: Unconscious

If patient is unconscious, and breathing normally, or uncertain breathing, go to: Unconscious (Airway Control) 74

INSTRUCTIONS

74 Unconscious (Airway Control)

Preliminary Questions

"Is the patient breathing normally?"

Continue to question 2. YES

Go to CPR Instructions 76

a) "Listen carefully, I will tell you what to do."

b) "Tell me every time they take a breath."

If there is more than 8 seconds between breaths:

c) "We need to start CPR." Go to CPR Instructions

"Did you witness the patient become unconscious?"

Continue to question 3.

Go to Unconscious: Trauma Patient located on the next page.

"Did the patient experience a fall, injury, or any other trauma prior to becoming unconscious?"

Go to Unconscious: Trauma Patient located on the next page. YES

Go to Unconscious: Non-Trauma Patient located on the next page.

Go to Unconscious: Trauma Patient located on the next page.

Secondary Questions

1) "What was the patient doing before they became unconscious?"

"Has the patient taken any alcohol, medication, or recreational drugs?"

Consider Overdose / Drug Influence | 56

"If the patient regains consciousness, let me know immediately."

Unconscious (Airway Control) 75

Trauma Patient (If unknown, default to Trauma)

- "Listen carefully, I will tell you what to do."
- "DO NOT MOVE THE PATIENT, especially head and neck, unless there is immediate danger to life."
- "Check for normal breathing until help arrives."
- "Watch for the chest to rise and fall."
- 6) If the patient STOPS breathing normally, go to CPR Instructions 76
- 7) If the patient vomits: "Roll the patient onto their side, sweep it all out of the mouth with your fingers and continue to monitor breathing."

Non-Trauma Patient

- "Listen carefully, I will tell you what to do."
- "Roll the patient onto their side."
- "Check for normal breathing until help arrives."
- "Put your cheek next to the nose and mouth to listen and feel for the air movement."
- "Watch for the chest to rise and fall."
- 6) If the patient STOPS breathing normally, go to CPR Instructions [76]
- 7) If the patient vomits: "Roll the patient onto their side, sweep it all out of the mouth with your fingers and continue to monitor breathing."

Preliminary Questions

- 1) "We need to start CPR. Before we start, is the entry door unlocked?"
- "Is there an AED available?" (Automatic External Defibrillator)
 - "Send someone to get it and let me know when it arrives at the patient's side." If caller is alone, have caller obtain AED and return to the patient.

 Continue to step 4. When AED arrives at patient, continue to

 AED INSTRUCTIONS. 93
- "Get the phone as close to them as possible. Do not hang up."
- 4) "Listen carefully. I will tell you what to do."
- 5) "Get the patient flat on their back on the floor or a stable and hard surface."
- 6) "Kneel by the patient's side and bare the patient's chest."

"Do you see any tubes or wires coming out of the chest or abdomen?"

- YES Do not begin CPR. Continue to the SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS section.
- NO Continue to CPR Instructions based on age of patient.
- 7) "Are you willing to give the patient breaths?"
 - YES Continue to CPR Instructions (based on age of patient) and include ALL steps.
 - NO Continue to CPR Instructions (based on age of patient) and skip steps 5-8.

- "Place the HEEL of one hand on the CENTER of the patient's chest, between the nipples."
- 2 "Place your other hand on top of that hand. Push down on the heels of your hands at least 2 inches."
- 3 "PUSH HARD AND PUSH FAST."

With Ventilations

4 "100 to 120 times a minute or about 2 times a second.
Count out loud with me. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7..."

If no ventilations, continue chest compressions until help arrives.

With Ventilations

- After 30 compressions, "Use one hand to lift up on the patient's chin so the head bends back."
- 6 "With your other hand, pinch the patient's nose shut and completely cover the patient's mouth with your mouth."
- 7 "Give 2 breaths, each lasting 1 second. Watch for chest rise."
- 8 Continue cycles of 30 compressions and 2 breathes until help arrives.

Alabama 9-1-1 Board Announces Grant Cycle 10 Recipients

Montgomery, AL— 9/17/2025 — During the September 17, 2025 meeting, the Alabama 9-1-1 Board approved awards to be granted to multiple applicants of Grant Cycle 10. The two key focuses in Grant Cycle 10 were updating Emergency Communication District call handling systems and NG911 recorders. This grant cycle had previously been tabled in September 2024 due to the need for statutory clarity on the source of grant awards within the 911 Fund and because of the passage and signing of Act 2025-376, the Alabama 9-1-1 Board was able to continue with grant cycle discussions. The determination for the awards was based on the content of the applications submitted and deliberation by the Board. Official award letters and grant agreements will be sent to each ECD in the coming weeks. Listed below are the districts, project types, and award amounts for Grant Cycle 10:

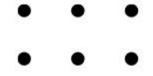
