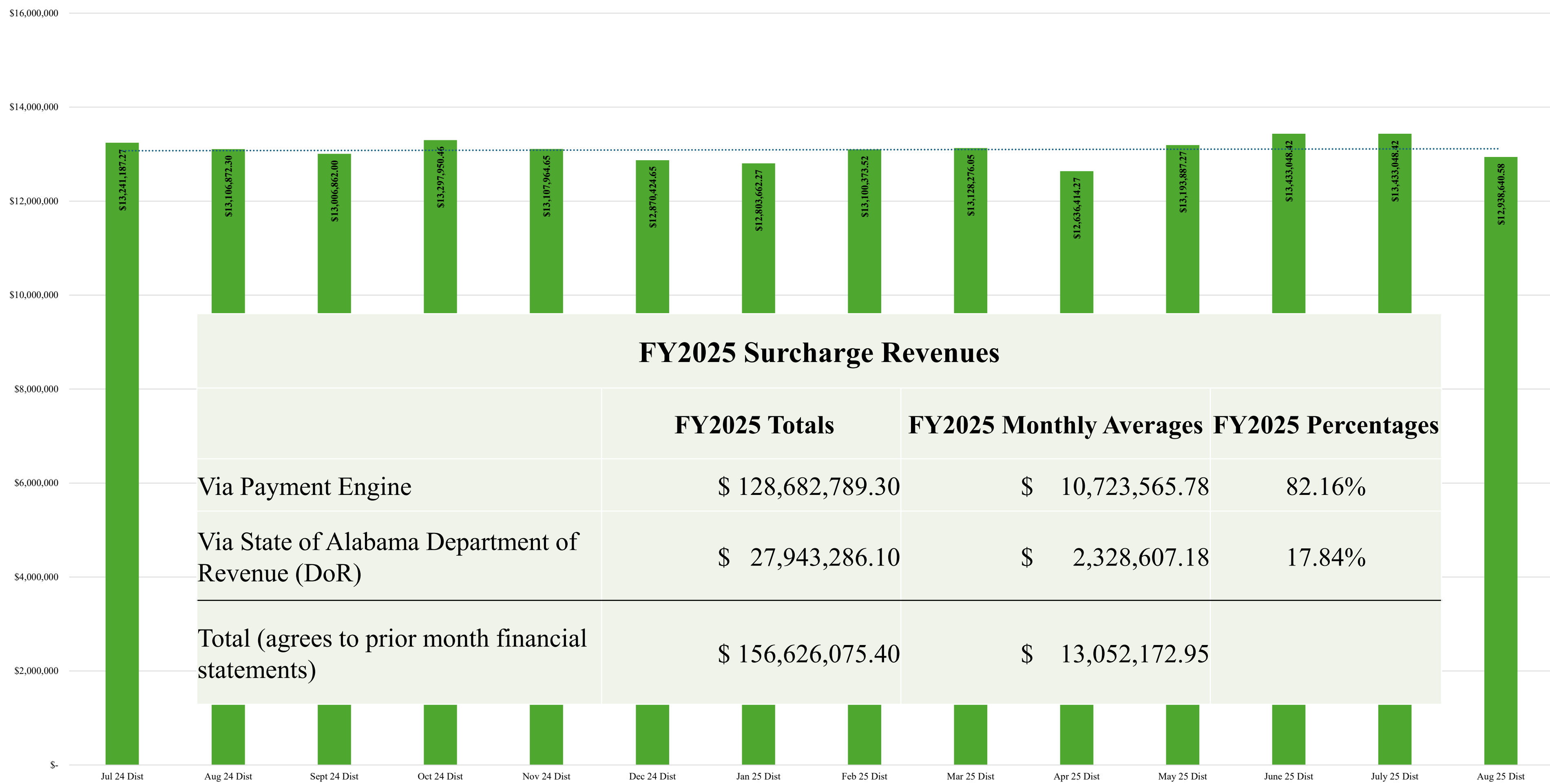

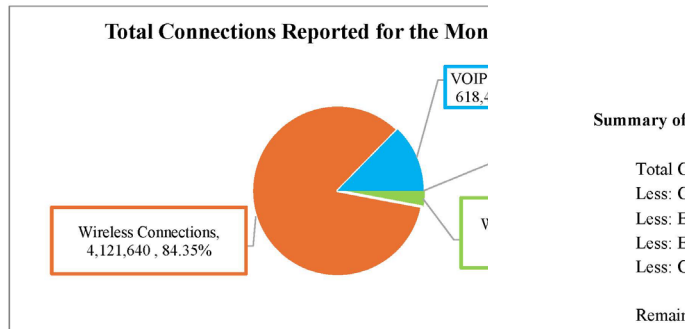
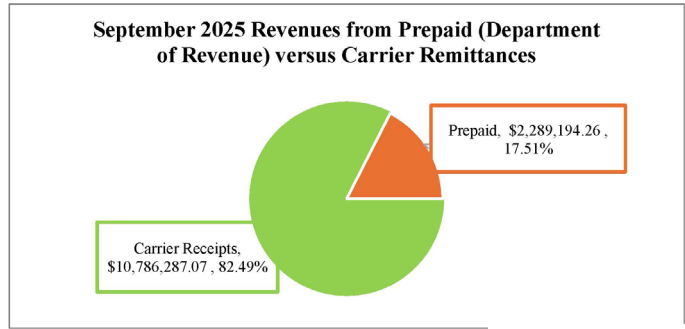

The information below represents the 9-1-1 Fund as a whole for collection of the service charge levied on voice communications service providers and all prepaid wireless 911 charges received from the Department of Revenue in the month of September 2025 scheduled for distribution in the month of October 2025. Your District's portion of these funds will be made available in your account on the dates indicated below. The full monthly distribution calculation can be found on the following pages.

During the previous month, 387 carriers reported 4,886,397 connections remitted through the Board's payment engine and the other revenues were collected by the Department of Revenue and paid over to the Board. The breakdown is as follows:

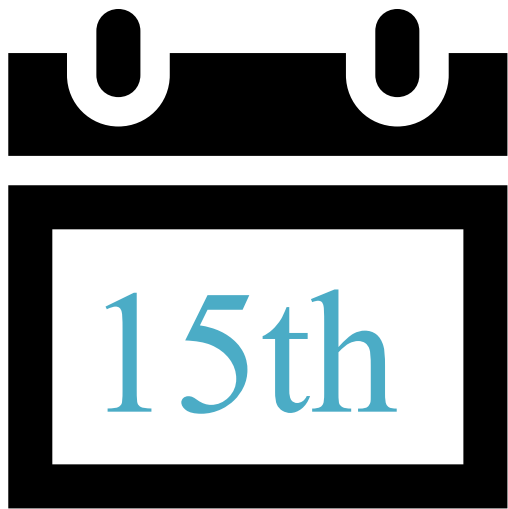

Alabama 9-1-1 Board Announces Grant Cycle 10 Recipients

Montgomery, AL— 9/17/2025 — During the September 17, 2025 meeting, the Alabama 9-1-1 Board approved awards to be granted to multiple applicants of Grant Cycle 10. The two key focuses in Grant Cycle 10 were updating Emergency Communication District call handling systems and NG911 recorders. This grant cycle had previously been tabled in September 2024 due to the need for statutory clarity on the source of grant awards within the 911 Fund and because of the passage and signing of Act 2025-376, the Alabama 9-1-1 Board was able to continue with grant cycle discussions. The determination for the awards was based on the content of the applications submitted and deliberation by the Board. Official award letters and grant agreements will be sent to each ECD in the coming weeks. Listed below are the districts, project types, and award amounts for Grant Cycle 10:

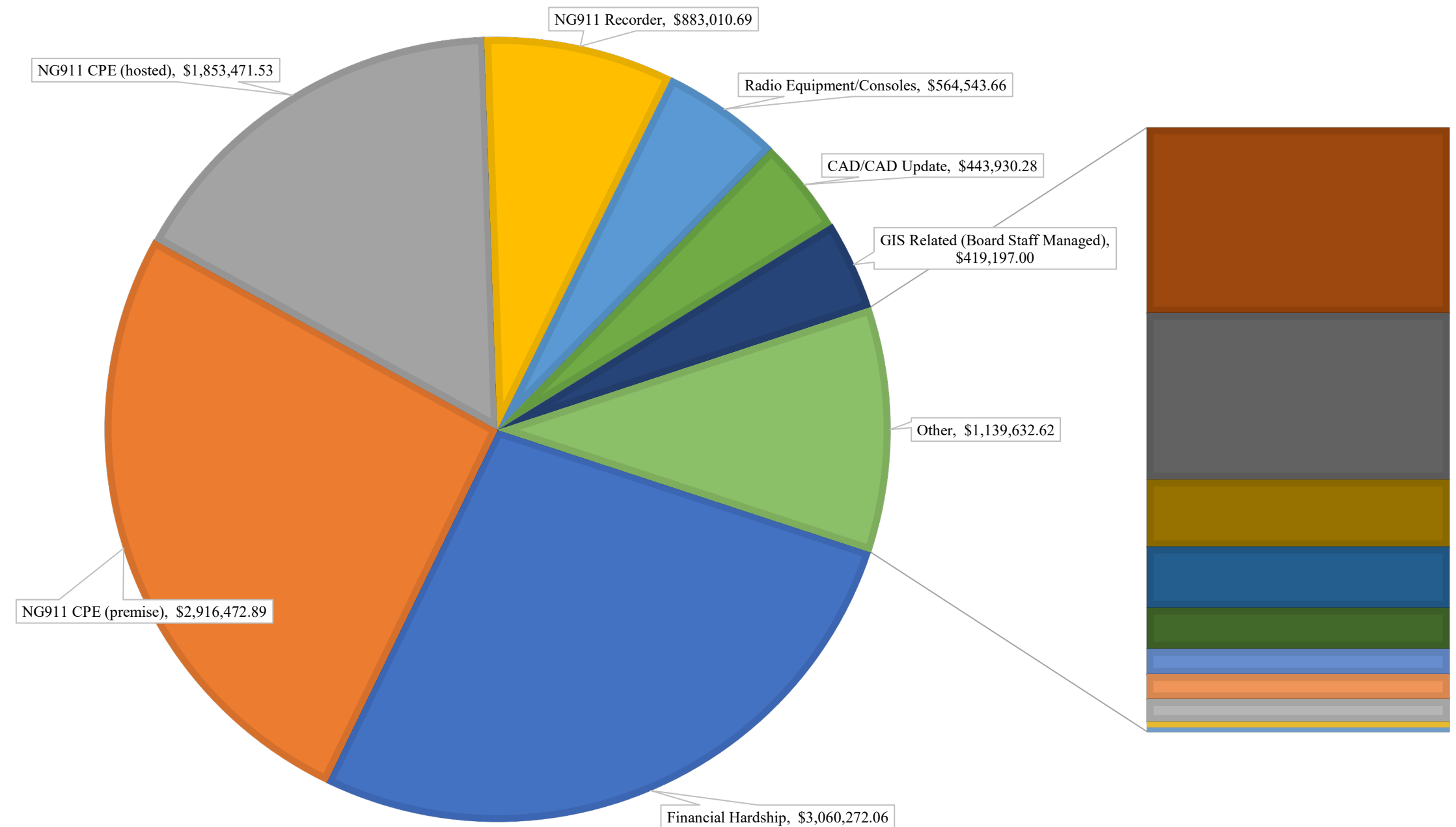

Hardship Grants

QUESTION:

What can an Emergency Communication District do if they determine they need a grant and there is no open grant cycle?

ANSWER:

Petition the Alabama 9-1-1 Board for a hardship grant.

Steps to petition for a hardship grant:

- Submit a letter to the Alabama 9-1-1 Board outlining in detail what is needed and why, the cost, and the reason the expense would be a hardship for the district.
- Upon receipt of the letter, the Board staff will respond in kind with directions and/or a request for additional information needed to assist the full Board in making the consideration. The request will be added as an item to the agenda of the next regular scheduled meeting of the Alabama 9-1-1 Board.
- District personnel will be required to attend the Board meeting in person to discuss the request and answer any follow up questions that Alabama 9-1-1 Board members may have.
