585-X-4-.09 Additional Distributions To Emergency Communication Districts From The Cost Recovery Fund.

The Board recognizes that it is of utmost importance that each Emergency Communication District (ECD) validly formed and operating within the State of Alabama as of September 30, 2011, at a minimum, be made whole, as contemplated by the passage of Act 2012-293 and adoption of the statewide 911 charges heretofore made.

In the event two or more ECDs have consolidated during the preceding fiscal year or consolidated before a Board decision regarding additional distributions to ECDs in November, then if a distribution is made, the distribution that an ECD would have received prior to consolidation shall be made to the consolidated, surviving ECD.

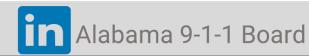

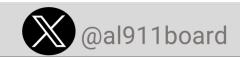

Proposed Rule Amendment 585-X-4-.09

585-X-4-.09 Additional Distributions To Emergency Communication Districts From The Cost Recovery Fund.

- (1) The Board recognizes that it is of utmost importance that each Emergency Communication District (ECD) validly formed and operating within the State of Alabama as of September 30, 2011, at a minimum, be made whole, as contemplated by the passage of Act 2012-293 and adoption of the statewide 911 charges heretofore made.
- (a) Purpose This rule establishes the authorized uses of the separate account funded by the statewide 911 charges remitted to the Alabama 911 Board, specifically for carrier and Emergency Communication District (ECD) services.

(b) Allocation of Funds

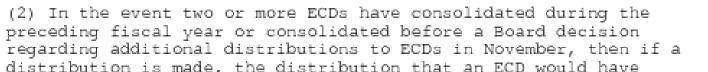
- i. Primary Use of Funds Except as otherwise provided in Section 11-98-4.1(6), the Alabama 911 Board shall deposit each month into a separate account—whether or not part of the 911 Fund -an amount equal to the remaining balance of the statewide 911 charges remitted for that month. These funds shall be used exclusively for:
- Costs related to administering a statewide 911 voice and data system in compliance with FCC technological requirements and Section 11-98-4.1(e)(8). Examples include: recurring network charges for call delivery, periodic and/or recurring licenses for user access to data maintenance platforms, NG911 GIS services, language translation services, transitional costs from legacy to NG911, etc.



Proposed Rule Amendment 585X-4-.09 (continued)

- Payment of actual and direct costs incurred by CMRS providers in complying with wireless E-911 service requirements established by the FCC Order and any related FCC rules or regulations. Eligible costs include, but are not limited to: Designing, upgrading, purchasing, leasing, programming, installing, testing, or maintaining necessary data, hardware, and software for Phase II Enhanced 911. Incremental costs of operating Phase II Enhanced 911.
- ii. Secondary Use of Funds After fulfilling the obligations in paragraph (a), any remaining funds may be allocated for the following purposes:
- Funding required training and certification of public safety telecommunicators in 11- 98-4.1 (e) (9) and 11-98-16.
- Funding advisory services provided to ECDs by the Board under 11-98-4.1.
- Funding a grant program for ECDs demonstrating financial hardship.
- Equal distribution among ECDs, as determined by majority vote of the Board.
- (c) Fiscal Year-End Balance

The Board establishes the maximum allowable balance to be carried over in the Carrier and ECD Services account at the conclusion of each fiscal year as not to exceed one month's baseline distribution due to ECDs.





Proposed Rule Amendment 585-X-5-.02-8

"Upon notice of noncompliance, the District's failure to return to compliance will result in some of the District's funding eligibility being forfeited." maintain certification.

(8) Penalties.

(a) Penalties shall be imposed for Districts that are noncompliant and notice of noncompliance shall be provided to the District by the Board. Upon notice of noncompliance, the following timeframes shall begin.

Non-District's failure to return to compliance Timeframes following notification	Percent District Withholding
3 months	25% of monthly distribution
6 months	50% of monthly distribution
9 months	75% of monthly distribution

Non-District's failure to return to compliance Timeframes following notification	Percent District Withholding
12 months	100% of monthly distribution

(b) District withholdings due to noncompliance will be held in escrow until the District becomes compliant. When a District becomes compliant, the monthly distribution will be restored along with any withheld funds on the Board's next monthly distributionwill result in some of the District's funding eligibility being forfeited.

(c) (b) For good cause shown, the Board reserves the right to waive any requirement imposed by these rules.

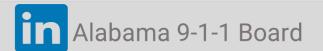


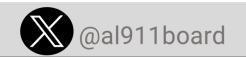


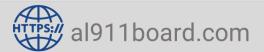
Legacy Cost Reimbursement: Program Year Costs



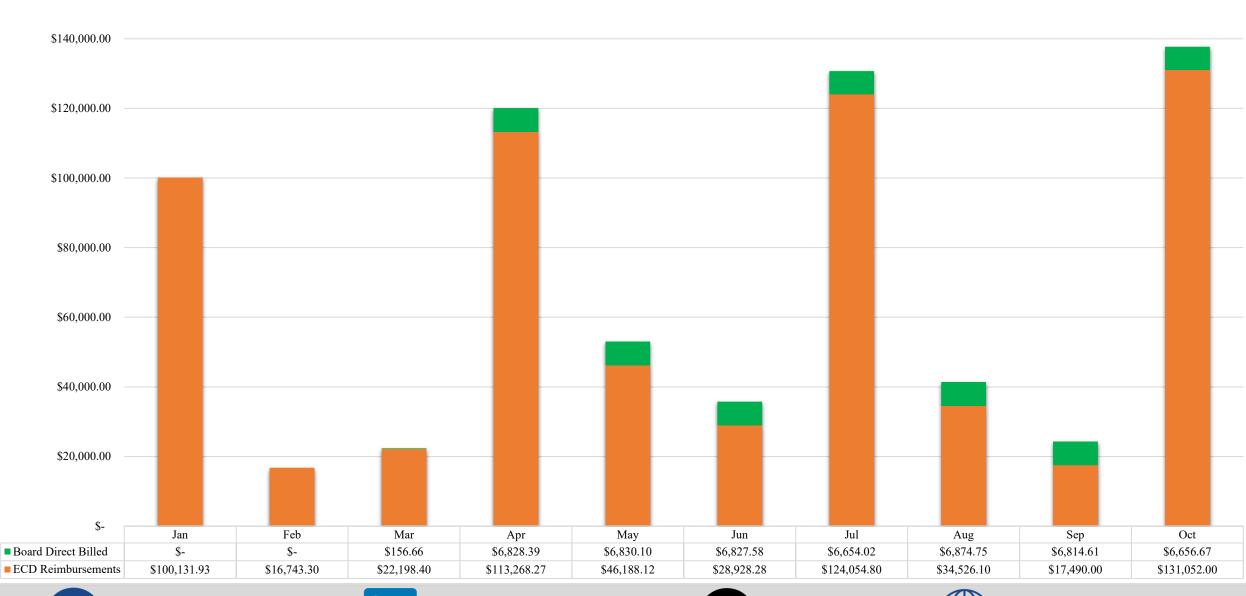


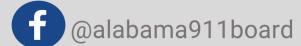




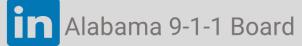


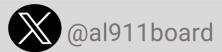

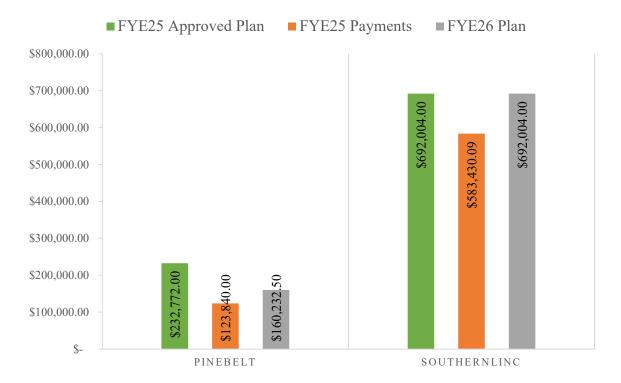

Summary

The Alabama Emergency Medical Dispatch (ALEMD) Course certifies telecommunicators to deliver lifesaving medical guidance to callers, using protocols developed in partnership with the Alabama Office of EMS. This program provides a unified protocol for Emergency Medical Dispatch in Alabama, meeting or exceeding national standards. The ALEMD Program delivers standardized, simulation-based training for Public Safety Telecommunicators. To earn certification, students must complete all prerequisites, an online pre-course, a two-day in-person class, and pass the required assessments. Certification is valid for 24 months and requires ongoing CEUs and CPR/T-CPR maintenance for renewal.

Guidebooks (printed or digital) are for use only by individuals who have completed all training requirements and are affiliated with a participating agency.

Prerequisites

- · Hold a valid Alabama PST certification
- · Possess a current CPR or Telecommunicator CPR (T-CPR) certification
- · Be employed by or affiliated with a recognized PSAP or ECD

Prerequisites must be verified prior to class by instructor.

*Prerequisites include FEMA and DHS training. This is part of the initial certification and does not count towards continuing education and does not need to be uploaded or submitted to the Board.

The busiest day during the reporting period was October 18th with 10,863 calls processed. This was also the 2nd-highest call volume day of the year.

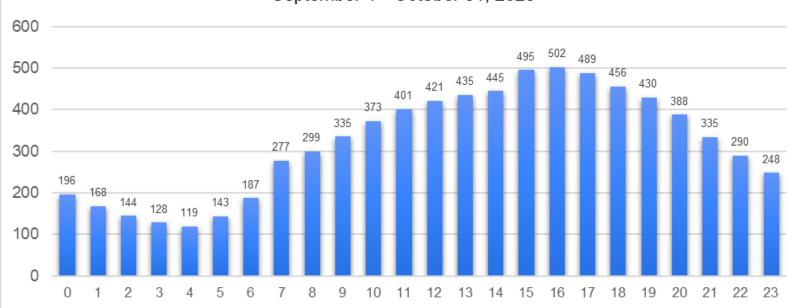
There have been a total of 469,988 calls since the last reporting period.

The lowest call volume day was August 10th, with 7,077 calls processed.

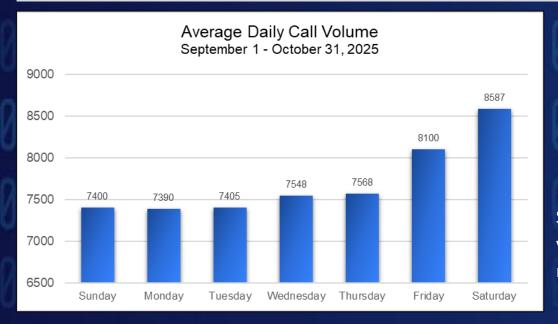
The average daily call volume was 7,704, down from 8,001 in the previous reporting period.

Average Calls by Hour September 1 - October 31, 2025

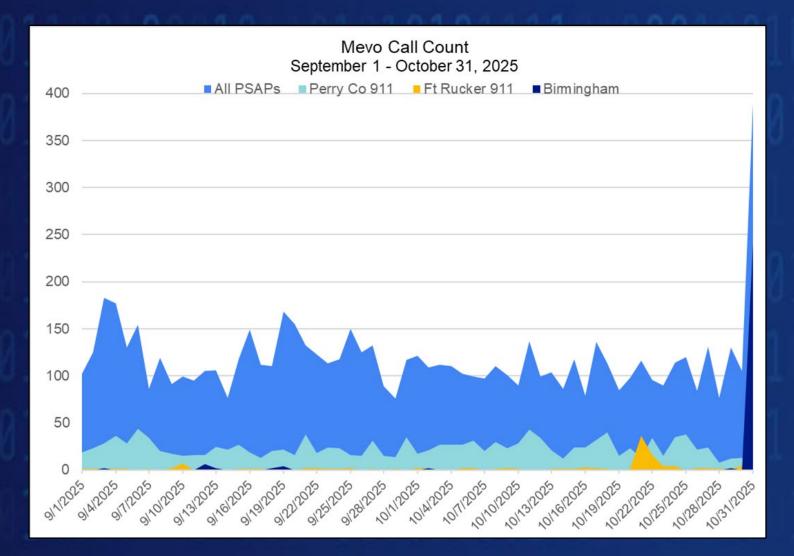




The 4:00 a.m. hour was the least busy, and the 4:00 p.m. hour was the most active for the reporting period.



Saturday proved to have the heaviest call volume, with Monday showing the least for the reporting period.

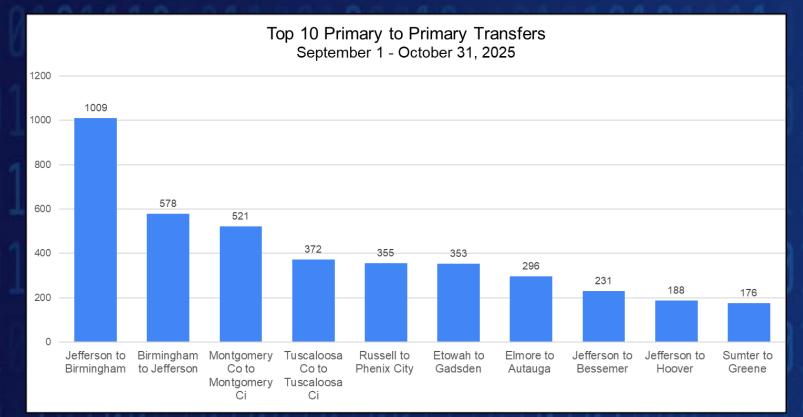




There were 7,195 total MEVO call count this reporting period with an average of 117 per day.

There were 12,797 Primary-to-Primary PSAP transfers for the reporting period, showing a nearly 6% decrease from the last reporting period of 13,569.

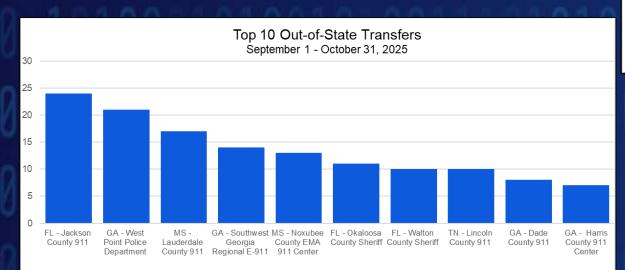

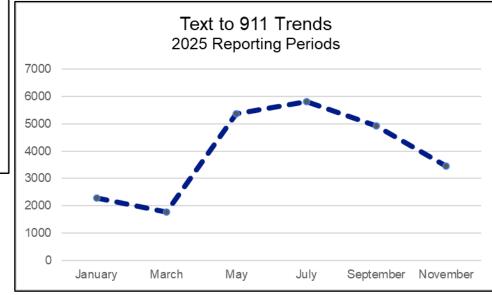
Total Call Volume for February 12, 2018 – October 31, 2025: 26,148,351

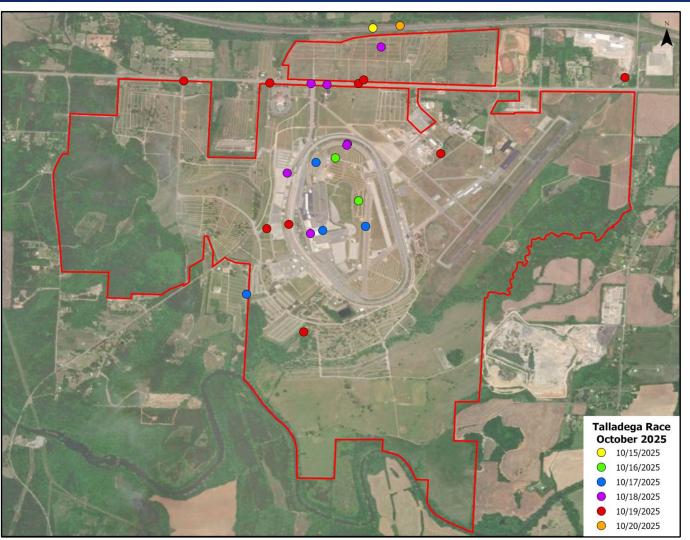
Talladega Speedway Geo-Routing



Geo-Routing for the Talladega fall races began on the morning of October 10th and went through October 20th.

Calls were geo-routed to the PSAP located on the racetrack to the Command Post phones (remote Vesta positions) for the entirety of the event.





Project Review

585-X-4-.09 Additional Distributions To Emergency Communication Districts From The Cost Recovery Fund.

The Board recognizes that it is of utmost importance that each Emergency Communication District (ECD) validly formed and operating within the State of Alabama as of September 30, 2011, at a minimum, be made whole, as contemplated by the passage of Act 2012-293 and adoption of the statewide 911 charges heretofore made.

In the event two or more ECDs have consolidated during the preceding fiscal year or consolidated before a Board decision regarding additional distributions to ECDs in November, then if a distribution is made, the distribution that an ECD would have received prior to consolidation shall be made to the consolidated, surviving ECD.

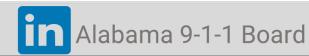

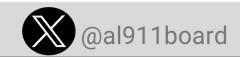

585-X-4-.09 Additional Distributions To Emergency Communication Districts From The Cost Recovery Fund.

- (1) The Board recognizes that it is of utmost importance that each Emergency Communication District (ECD) validly formed and operating within the State of Alabama as of September 30, 2011, at a minimum, be made whole, as contemplated by the passage of Act 2012-293 and adoption of the statewide 911 charges heretofore made.
- (a) Purpose This rule establishes the authorized uses of the separate account funded by the statewide 911 charges remitted to the Alabama 911 Board, specifically for carrier and Emergency Communication District (ECD) services.

(b) Allocation of Funds

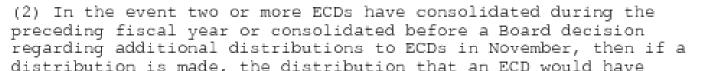
- i. Primary Use of Funds Except as otherwise provided in Section 11-98-4.1(6), the Alabama 911 Board shall deposit each month into a separate account—whether or not part of the 911 Fund -an amount equal to the remaining balance of the statewide 911 charges remitted for that month. These funds shall be used exclusively for:
- Costs related to administering a statewide 911 voice and data system in compliance with FCC technological requirements and Section 11-98-4.1(e)(8). Examples include: recurring network charges for call delivery, periodic and/or recurring licenses for user access to data maintenance platforms, NG911 GIS services, language translation services, transitional costs from legacy to NG911, etc.



Proposed Rule Amendment 585X-4-.09 (continued)

- Payment of actual and direct costs incurred by CMRS providers in complying with wireless E-911 service requirements established by the FCC Order and any related FCC rules or regulations. Eligible costs include, but are not limited to: Designing, upgrading, purchasing, leasing, programming, installing, testing, or maintaining necessary data, hardware, and software for Phase II Enhanced 911. Incremental costs of operating Phase II Enhanced 911.
- ii. Secondary Use of Funds After fulfilling the obligations in paragraph (a), any remaining funds may be allocated for the following purposes:
- Funding required training and certification of public safety telecommunicators in 11- 98-4.1 (e) (9) and 11-98-16.
- Funding advisory services provided to ECDs by the Board under 11-98-4.1.
- Funding a grant program for ECDs demonstrating financial hardship.
- Equal distribution among ECDs, as determined by majority vote of the Board.
- (c) Fiscal Year-End Balance

The Board establishes the maximum allowable balance to be carried over in the Carrier and ECD Services account at the conclusion of each fiscal year as not to exceed one month's baseline distribution due to ECDs.

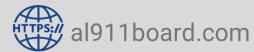
On March 5, 2024, the Alabama Public Service Commission (Commission), in Docket No. 33429, approved an all-services distributed overlay over the 334 NPA. Cities in the 334 NPA include but are not limited to Montgomery, Dothan, Auburn, Prattville, Phenix City, Enterprise, Opelika, Selma and many other smaller communities. The new 483 NPA will serve the same geographic area currently served by the existing 334 NPA. Additionally, central office (CO) codes in the 334 NPA will be available for assignment only when all assignable prefixes in the 334 NPA have been assigned. The 334-334 NXX will be released as an assignable CO code after the new 483 NPA in-service date.











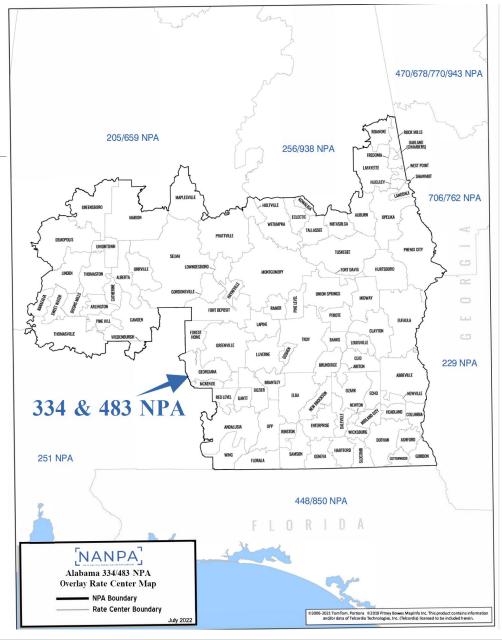

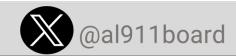


Facilitating Implementation of Next Generation 911 Services (NG911), Report and Order, PS Docket Nos. 21-479 and 18-64

- ❖FCC Order designed to expedite NG911 transition
- stressed the importance of establishing a framework to ensure that NG911 deployments occur in a timely fashion
- ❖ first nationwide NG911 transition rules that define the responsibilities and set deadlines for originating service providers to implement NG911 capabilities on their networks and deliver 911 calls to NG911 systems
- *require originating service providers (OSPs) to transition to NG911 in two phases in response to a request by a state or local 911 authority
 - Phase 1-OSPs must deliver 911 traffic in IP-based Session Initiation Protocol (SIP) format to delivery points designated by the 911 authority
 - Phase 2-OSPs must deliver 911 traffic to designated delivery points in an IP-based SIP format that supports routing, caller location, and transmission of emergency information in accordance with NG911 commonly accepted standards
- *require OSPs to be responsible for the costs of delivering 911 traffic in the required format to designated NG911 delivery points within the state
- *preserve the authority of state and local government to adopt alternative approaches to the configuration, timing, and cost responsibility for NG911 implementation within their jurisdictions







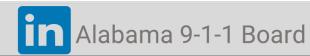
